Associate Professor Selwyn Cornish AM

Selwyn Cornish is a Visiting Fellow in the School of Economics and was a member of the ANU academic staff for over 40 years. His scholarly interests are in the history of economic thought, the history of economic policy, and the economic development of India. He has written extensively on Australian economists, especially Leslie Melville and Roland Wilson.

A former Chair of the ACT Board of Secondary School Studies, he was made a Member of the Order of Australia in 2004 for "service to senior secondary education in the Australian Capital Territory through the development and maintenance of system wide policy and standards in relation to curriculum, assessment and moderation".

In addition to his academic pursuits, Mr Cornish has served the University in a number of other capacities including Sub Dean and Associate Dean of the Faculty of Economics and Commerce, Chair of the University's Admissions Committee, Dean of Students, University Marshal and Bursar and Fellow of University House. He is currently Honorary Head of Toad Hall and is on the Council of Advisors for the Golden Key International Honour Society.

This Award is in recognition of Associate Professor Cornish's outstanding contributions to the life of the campus community.
