Venue: A.D. Hope Building [14]

The museum houses a representative collection of Greek and Roman antiquities, ranging in time from about 1500BC to 500AD. Built up from 1962, the collection gives students, scholars and the wider community the opportunity to study the material evidence for life in those ancient societies. Our collection includes items from well-known centres such as Athens and Rome, along with material from many other parts of the Greco-Roman Empire – a world that once encompassed the whole of the Mediterranean and beyond. Its cultural impact remains as strong today as it ever did.

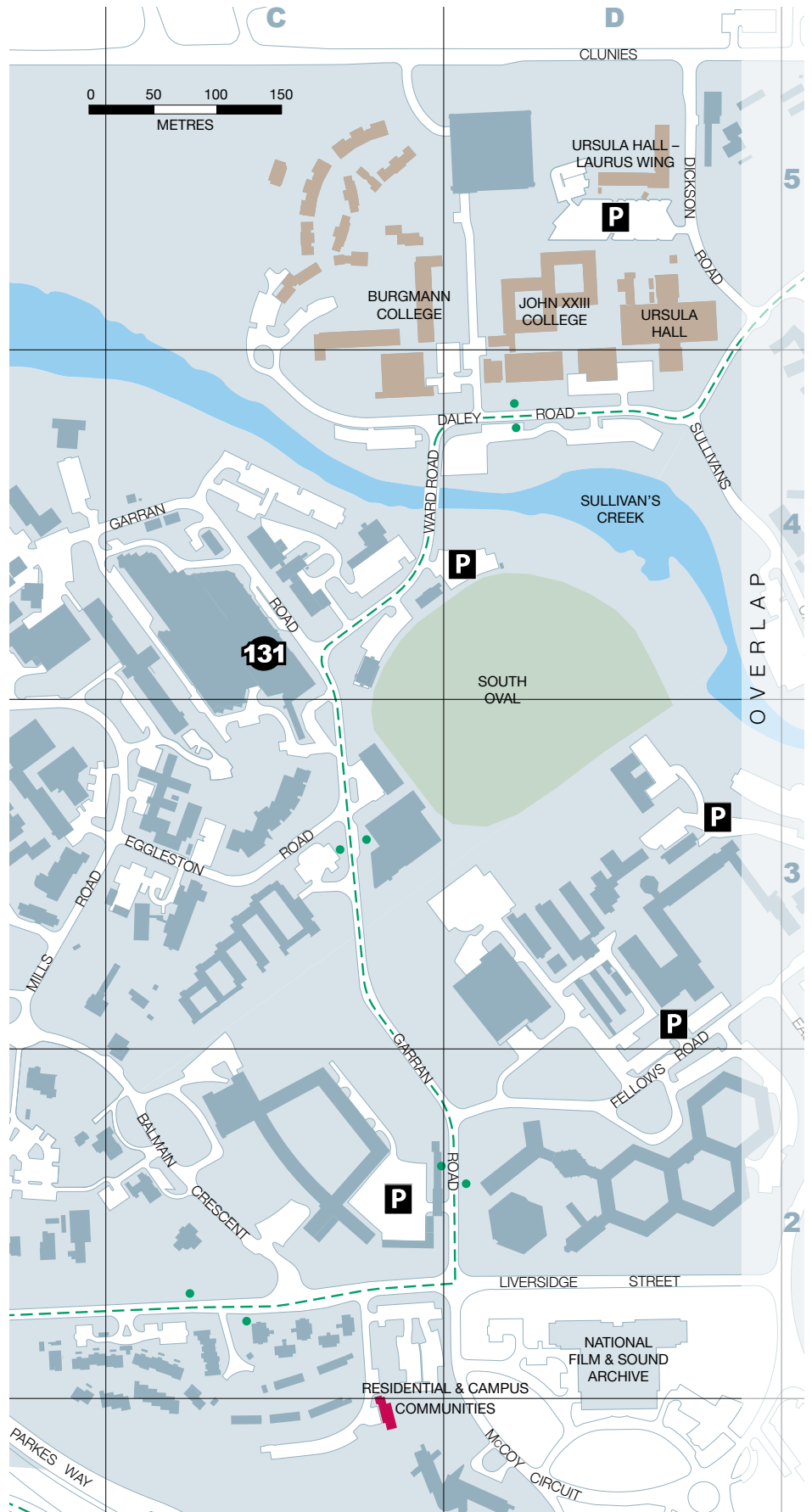

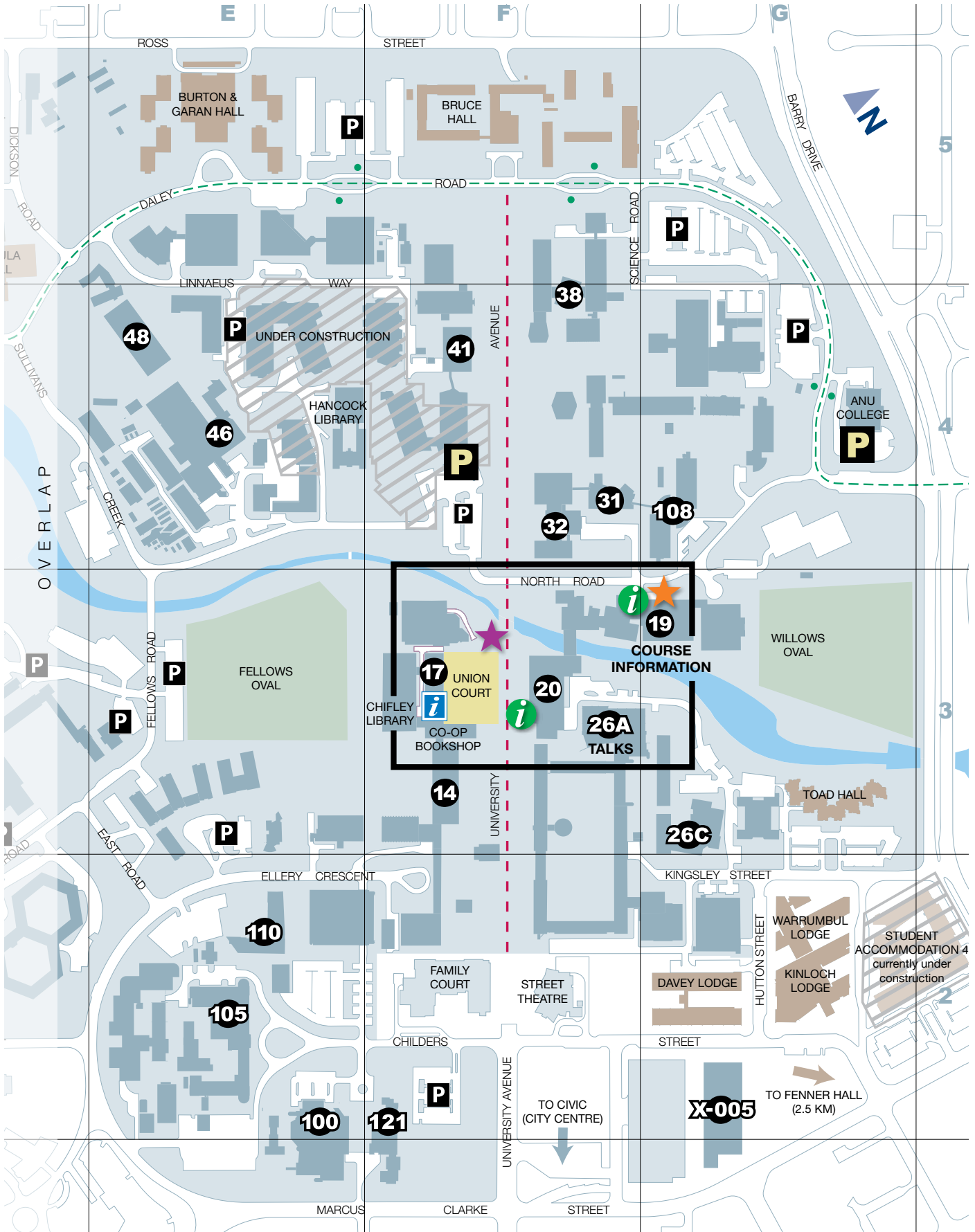
